

A BILL FOR AN ACT

To further amend Public Law No. 11-59, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 11-69 and 11-79, by further amending section 4 to change a use of Yap State funds, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 4 of Public Law No. 11-59, as amended by
2 Public Law No. 11-69, is hereby further amended to read as
3 follows:

4 "Section 4. The sum of \$750,000, or so much thereof as
5 may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the General
6 Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal
7 year ending September 30, 2001, to provide funds for
8 infrastructure and other projects and programs in the State
9 of Yap. The funds appropriated under this section shall be
10 apportioned as follows:

11 (1) [~~Outer Island infrastructure projects~~]
12 Grant to Council of Tamol of the Outer Islands
13 to be used to pay the balance due on a Land
14 Sale Agreement entered into on March 31, 1999,
15 and to reimburse those entities that provided
16 the down payment on the sale. Title of the
17 land purchased on Yap proper and
18 responsibility for administration of such land
19 to be held by the Council for the benefit of
