

A BILL FOR AN ACT

To further amend Public Law No. 7-35, as amended, by amending section 1 thereof to change the use of certain fund appropriated therein, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 7-35, as amended by
2 Public Laws Nos. 7-43, 7-68, 8-34, 8-74 and 13-28, is hereby
3 further amended to read as follows:

4 "Section 1. Statewide public projects. The sum of
5 \$400,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary,
6 is hereby appropriated from the General Fund of the
7 Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year
8 ending September 30, 1992, for the purpose of
9 funding statewide public projects in the State of
10 Chuuk. The sum appropriated by this section shall
11 be apportioned as follows:

- 12 (1) Chuuk medical students allowance - Pacific Basin
- 13 Medical Officers Training Program\$ 20,400
- 14 (2) Chuuk Red Cross 5,000
- 15 (3) Medical supplies and equipment 50,000
- 16 (4) Rural water system - TOCA 40,000
