

A BILL FOR AN ACT

To further amend Public Law No. 13-36, as amended, by amending sections 2, 3 and 4 thereof to change the use of certain funds appropriated therein, by amending section 5 thereof to change the allottee of certain funds, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1           Section 1. Section 2 of Public Law No. 13-36, as amended by  
2 Public Law No. 13-49, is hereby further amended to read as  
3 follows:

4           "Section 2. The sum of \$400,000, or so much thereof as  
5 may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the  
6 General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for  
7 the fiscal year ending September 30, 2004, to provide  
8 funding for social and economic development projects in  
9 the State of Yap. The funds appropriated under this  
10 section shall be apportioned as follows:

11           (1) Post-secondary scholarships for Yapese students,  
12 subject to the following conditions:

13                   (a) funds appropriated under this subsection may  
14 only be used for tuition, books, and on-campus room and  
15 board expenses;

16                   (b) the maximum amount available to any  
17 individual student enrolled at an institution of higher  
18 education located outside the FSM is \$7,000;

1 (c) the maximum amount available to any  
 2 individual student enrolled at the College of Micronesia  
 3 is \$1,500; and

4 (d) if the FSM Scholarship Board does not meet to  
 5 award scholarship funds appropriated by this section,  
 6 the Secretary of the FSM Department of Health, Education  
 7 and Social Affairs (HESA), or his designee, and the Yap  
 8 State member of the FSM Scholarship Board may determine  
 9 the recipients of such funds .....\$ 180,000

 3           General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for  
 4           the fiscal year ending September 30, 2004, to provide  
 5           funding for social and economic development projects in  
 6           the State of Pohnpei. The funds appropriated under this  
 7           section shall be apportioned as follows:

23 "Section 4. The sum of \$1,200,000, or so much thereof  
 24 as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the  
 25 General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for

1 the fiscal year ending September 30, 2004, to provide  
 2 funding for social and economic development projects in  
 3 the State of Chuuk. The funds appropriated under this  
 4 section shall be apportioned as follows:

22 Section 4. Section 5 of Public Law No. 13-36, as amended by  
 23 Public Law No. 13-49, is hereby further amended to read as  
 24 follows:

25 "Section 5. Allotment and management of funds and lapse

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1           date.

2           (1) All funds appropriated by this act shall be allotted, managed,  
3           allottee of the funds appropriated under sections 1, 2  
4           and 3 of this act shall be the President of the  
5           Federated States of Micronesia or his designee, except  
6           that the allottee of the funds appropriated under  
7           subsections 1(1), 1(3) and 1(4) of this act shall be the  
8           Governor of the State of Kosrae; the allottee of the  
9           funds appropriated under sections 2(3) and 2(4) of this  
10          act shall be the Governor of the State of Yap; the  
11          allottee of the funds appropriated under sections 2(5)  
12          and 2(6) shall be the Speaker of Congress; the allottee  
13          of the funds appropriated under subsection 3(2)(a)(i)  
14          shall be the mayor of Kolonia Town; the allottee of the  
15          funds appropriated under subsections 3(2)(a)(ii),  
16          3(2)(a)(iv) and 3(2)(a)(v) shall be the Sokehs  
17          magistrate; ~~and~~ the allottee of the funds appropriated  
18          under subsection 3(2)(a)(iii) shall be the mayor of  
19          Nukuoro; and the allottee of funds appropriated under  
20          subsection 3(2)(c)(v) shall be the Pohnpei  
21          Transportation Authority. The allottee of the funds  
22          appropriated under section 4 of this act shall be the  
23          Chuuk State Commission on Improvement Projects, except  
24          that the funds appropriated under section 4(1)(c) of  
25          this act shall be allotted to the President of the

1 Federated States of Micronesia.

2 (2) The allottees of the funds appropriated  
3 herein shall be responsible for ensuring that these  
4 funds, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are used  
5 solely for the purpose specified herein, and shall  
6 report back to the Congress on the status of these funds  
7 no later than September 30, 2005. The authority of the  
8 allottees to obligate such funds shall not lapse until  
9 fully expended."

10 Section 5. This act shall become law upon approval by the  
11 President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its  
12 becoming law without such approval.
