
A BILL FOR AN ACT

To further amend Public Law No. 13-36, as amended, by amending the title and section 4, to change the use of certain funds, to repeal certain appropriations specified therein, to create a fund entitled "Public Projects for Chuuk Election District No. 5" within the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. The title of Public Law No. 13-36, as amended by
2 Public Laws Nos. 13-49 and 13-66, is hereby further amended to
3 read as follows:

4 "An act to appropriate the sum of [~~\$2,800,000~~
5 \$2,560,000, from the local revenue in the General Fund
6 of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal
7 year ending September 30, 2004, for the purpose of
8 funding social and economic development projects in the
9 states, and for other purposes."

10 Section 2. Section 4 of Public Law No. 13-36, as amended by
11 Public Laws Nos. 13-49 and 13-66, is hereby further amended to
12 read as follows:

13 "Section 4. The sum of [~~\$1,200,000~~ \$960,000, or so
14 much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated
15 from the General Fund of the Federated States of
16 Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30,
17 2004, to provide funding for social and economic
18 development projects in the State of Chuuk. The funds
