

A BILL FOR AN ACT

To appropriate the sum of \$50,000 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia to be used for the purpose of funding drought relief projects and programs in the State of Pohnpei, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. The sum of \$50,000, or so much thereof as may be  
2 necessary, is hereby appropriated from the General Fund of the  
3 Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending  
4 September 30, 2007 for drought relief projects and programs in the  
5 State of Pohnpei. The funds appropriated under section 1 of this  
6 act shall be apportioned as follows:

- 7 (1) State of Pohnpei .....\$ 50,000
- 8 a. drought relief projects and programs
- 9 for Election District No. 2 ..... 50,000

10 Section 2. Allotment and management of funds and lapse date.

11 All funds appropriated by this act shall be allotted, managed,  
12 administered and accounted for in accordance with applicable laws,  
13 including, but not limited to, the Financial Management Act of  
14 1979 and the amended Compact of Free Association between the  
15 United States Government and the Government of the Federated  
16 States of Micronesia and its related agreements. The allottee  
17 shall be responsible for ensuring that these funds, or so much  
18 thereof as may be necessary, are used solely for the purpose  
19 specified in this act, and that no obligations are incurred in

1 excess of the sum appropriated. The allottee of the funds  
2 appropriated under this act shall be Meninkeder Lapalap of  
3 Madolenihmw. The authority of the allottee to obligate funds  
4 appropriated by this act shall lapse on 30 September, 2008."

5 Section 3. This act shall become law upon approval by the  
6 President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its  
7 becoming law without such approval.
