

A BILL FOR AN ACT

To further amend Public Law No. 16-18, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 16-24, 16-32, 16-39, 16-45, 16-54, and 16-67, by amending section 1 thereof, to change the use of certain funds previously appropriated for funding Economic and Social Projects and Programs for the State of Yap for fiscal year 2010, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 16-18, as amended
2 by Public Laws Nos. 16-24, 16-32, 16-39, 16-45, 16-54, and
3 16-67, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

4 "Section 1. The sum of \$3,301,000, or so much
5 thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated
6 from the General Fund of the Federated States of
7 Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30,
8 2010, for the purpose of funding Economic and Social
9 Projects and Programs in the States of Yap, Kosrae,
10 Pohnpei and Chuuk. The funds appropriated under this
11 section shall be apportioned as follows:
