**PUBLIC LAW NO. 18-122**

A BILL FOR AN ACT

To further amend Public Law No. 18-70, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 18-98 and 18-112, by amending sections 4, 5 and 6, thereof, to change the use and allottee of funds previously appropriated for public projects and social programs for the people of Pohnpei and Chuuk States, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 4 of Public Law No. 18-70, as amended by  
2 Public Laws Nos. 18-98 and 18-112, is hereby further amended to read

23 Section 3. Section 6 of Public Law No. 18-70, as amended by  
24 Public Laws Nos. 18-98 and 18-112, is hereby further amended to  
25 read as follows:

1           "Section 6. Allotment and management of funds and lapse  
2           date. All funds appropriated by this act shall be  
3           allotted, managed, administered and accounted for in  
4           accordance with applicable laws, including, but not  
5           limited to, the Financial Management Act of 1979. The  
6           allottee shall be responsible for ensuring that these  
7           funds, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are used  
8           solely for the purpose specified in this act, and that  
9           no obligations are incurred in excess of the sum  
10          appropriated. The allottee of the funds appropriated  
11          under section 2 of this act shall be the Governor of Yap  
12          State EXCEPT THAT the funds appropriated under  
13          subsection 2(i) shall be the President of COM-FSM. The  
14          allottee of funds appropriated under sections 3 and 4 of  
15          this act shall be the President of the Federated States  
16          of Micronesia or his designee EXCEPT THAT the funds  
17          appropriated under subsections a, b, c, d, e, f, g, h,  
18          i, j, k, l, m, n, o, s, t, u, v, w, x and ag, ah and aj  
19          of section 3 this act shall be the Mayor of Lelu Town  
20          Government or his designee; the funds appropriate under  
21          subsection 4(2)(K) shall be the Mayor of Kolonia Town  
22          Government; the funds appropriated under subsection  
23          4(2)(l) shall be the Chief Magistrate of Sokehs  
24          Municipal Government; the funds appropriated under  
25          subsection 4(2)(m) shall be the Mayor of Nukuoro

1           Municipal Government; the funds appropriated under  
2           subsections a, b, c, d, e, f and g of section 4(1),  
3           subsection 4(2)(1), subsections 4(3)(b), (c), (d), (f)  
4           and (p) of this act shall be the Pohnpei Transportation  
5           Authority, and the funds appropriated under subsection  
6           4(3)(t) shall be the Luhkenmoanlap of Kitti. The  
7           allottee of funds appropriated under subsection 4(1)(h)  
8           shall be the President of the Federated States of  
9           Micronesia or his designee. The allottee of funds  
10          appropriate under subsection 4(2)(g) of this act shall  
11          be the Administrator of the MiCare program. The  
12          allottee of funds appropriated under subsections 5(1)  
13          and 5(3) of this act shall be the Governor of Chuuk  
14          State or his designee. The allottee of funds  
15          appropriated under subsection 5(2) of this act shall be  
16          the Mortlock Islands Development Authority. The  
17          allottee of funds appropriated under subsection 5(4) of  
18          this act shall be the Southern Namoneas Development  
19          Authority. The allottee of funds appropriated under  
20          subsection 5(5) of this act shall be the Faichuk  
21          Development Authority. The allottee of funds  
22          appropriated under subsection 5(6) of this act shall be  
23          the General Manager of the Northwest Island Development  
24          Authority. The authority of the allottee to obligate  
25          funds appropriated by this act shall lapse on September
