

A BILL FOR AN ACT

To appropriate a supplemental budget in the amount of \$578,396 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2015, by amending sections 1, 2, 3, 6, 8, 9, and 13 of Public Law No. 18-89, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 18-102, 18-110, 18-116, and 19-02 to change the conditions of certain funds therein, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 18-89, as amended by
2 Public Laws Nos. 18-102, 18-110, 18-116, and 19-02, is hereby
3 further amended to read as follows:

4 "Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this act is to
5 appropriate the sum of [~~\$98,453,248~~] \$99,031,644 from the
6 General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the
7 fiscal year ending September 30, 2015, for the purpose of
8 funding the operations of all branches of the National
9 Government of the Federated States of Micronesia, its agencies,
10 various programs, grants, subsidies and contributions and
11 Capital and Human Resources Development. The National
12 Government's share of the Amended Compact funds has been
13 reduced to zero except that the National Government will retain
14 ten percent (10%) of the Supplemental Education Grant funds as
15 is reflected in the budget for the Department of Education.
16 The budget shall also include appropriations for COM-FSM from
17 sector grants as well as appropriations from amended Compact
18 carry-over funds."

1 Section 2. Section 2 of Public Law No. 18-89, as amended by
 2 Public Laws Nos. 18-102, 18-110, 18-116, and 19-02 is hereby further
 3 amended to read as follows:

6 Section 7. Section 13 of Public Law No. 18-89 is hereby amended
7 to read as follows:

8 “Section 13. Allotment and management of funds and lapse
9 dates.

10 (1) General provisions.

11 (a) All funds appropriated by this act shall be
12 allotted, managed, administered and accounted for in
13 accordance with applicable law, including, but not limited
14 to, the Financial Management Act of 1979.

15 (b) The allottees shall be responsible for ensuring
16 that these funds, or so much thereof as may be necessary,
17 are used solely for the purposes specified in this act,
18 and that no obligations are incurred in excess of the sums
19 appropriated.

20 (2) Allottees. The allottees of the funds
21 appropriated by this act are as follows:

22 (a) Section 2 - the allottee of these funds shall be
23 the President of the Federated States of Micronesia;

24 (b) Section 3 - the allottee of these funds shall be
25 the Speaker of the Congress of the Federated States of

1 Micronesia;

2 (c) Section 4 – the allottee of these funds shall be
3 the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Federated
4 States of Micronesia;

5 (d) Section 5 – the allottee of these funds shall be
6 the Public Auditor of the Federated States of Micronesia;

7 (e) Sections 6 through 9 – the allottee of these
8 funds shall be the President of the Federated States of
9 Micronesia; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that for the following
10 subsections of sections 8 through 9 of this act:

11 (i) Section 8(6)(g) – the allottee shall be the
12 President of the College of Micronesia – FSM; and

13 (ii) Section 8, (13)(a) through (d) – the allottee of
14 these funds shall be the Chief Justice of the respective
15 State Supreme Court;

16 (iii) Section 8 (10)(a) through (i) – the
17 allottee of these funds shall be the Speaker of the
18 Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia; and

19 (iv) Section 9(1)(a) through (c) – the allottee of
20 these funds shall be the President of the College of
21 Micronesia-FSM.

22 (v) Section 9(4)(g), the allottee of these funds
23 shall be the Governor of Chuuk State.

24 (vi) Section 9(4)(i), the allottee of these funds
25 shall be the Governor of Yap State.

1 (3) Lapse date. The authority of the allottees
2 to obligate funds appropriated by this act shall lapse as
3 of September 30, 2015; PROVIDED HOWEVER, that the funds
4 appropriated under section 9 of this act shall not lapse
5 and the funds appropriated under sections 8(14) (r)-(y)
6 shall not lapse until September 30, 2016.

7 Section 8. This act shall act shall become law upon approval by
8 the President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its
9 becoming law without such approval.
