
A RESOLUTION

To confirm the nomination of Mr. Peter Garamfel to serve as a member representing the State of Yap on the Board of Directors of the National Oceanic Resource Management Authority (NORMA).

1 WHEREAS, pursuant to Public Law No. 15-38, section 201(1),
2 which amended title 24 of the Code of the Federated States of
3 Micronesia, as amended, the Federated States of Micronesia
4 established a five-member Board of Directors for the National
5 Oceanic Resource Management Authority; and

6 WHEREAS, pursuant to Public law No. 15-38, section
7 201(1)(b), the President of the Federated States of Micronesia
8 nominates one member from each State to serve on the Board of
9 Directors of NORMA, in consultation with each State Governor
10 and with the advice and consent of Congress; and

11 WHEREAS, pursuant to Public Law No 15-38, section
12 201(1)(a), the President has nominated Mr. Peter Garamfel, a
13 nominee recommended by the Governor of the State of Yap, to
14 serve as the Yap State representative on the Board of Directors
15 of NORMA; and

16 WHEREAS, Mr. Peter Garamfel has the experience and
17 qualifications which make him a suitable candidate to serve on
18 the NORMA Board of Directors; and

19 WHEREAS, pursuant to Public Law No. 15-38, section 202(1),
20 board members are appointed to serve a two-year term; now,

1 therefore,

2 BE IT RESOLVED by the Nineteenth Congress of the Federated
3 States of Micronesia, Second Regular Session, 2015, that
4 Congress hereby confirms the nomination of Mr. Peter Garamfel
5 to serve as a member of the Board of Directors of the National
6 Oceanic Resource Management Authority representing Yap State;
7 and

8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
9 resolution be transmitted to the President of the Federated
10 States of Micronesia, the Governor of each State of the Nation,
11 and Mr. Peter Garamfel.
